- To prohibit construction of a continuous wall or fence between the United States and Mexico, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Build Bridges Not
- 5 Walls Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds the following:

1	(1) The existing United States-Mexico border
2	infrastructure already includes physical barriers,
3	drones, cameras, motion detectors, thermal imaging
4	sensors, ground sensors, and other surveillance tools.
5	(2) The United States already maintains ap-
6	proximately 650 miles of border fence in areas that
7	most effectively stop the unauthorized entry of peo-
8	ple, vehicles, drugs, arms, and illicit items.
9	(3) The number of U.S. Border Patrol agents
10	nearly doubled from $10,717$ in 1993 to $21,370$ in
11	2016.
12	(4) Most experts believe that the Trump Ad-
13	ministration's border wall will cost between \$15 bil-
14	lion to \$25 billion, not including additional mainte-
15	nance costs.
16	(5) Harsh terrain and conditions along remote
17	parts of the United States-Mexico border make the
18	construction of a wall or fence impractical, ineffec-
19	tive, and costly.
20	(6) Former CBP Commissioner Gil Kerlikowske
21	stated that building a continuous wall is not "fea-
22	sible" or the "smartest way to use taxpayer money".
23	(7) A continuous border wall would likely harm
24	wildlife, destroy sensitive habitat for endangered
25	species, damage the environment and the natural

flow of floodwaters, and lead to costly litigation with
 landowners, the Native American community, and
 stakeholders.

4 (8) Border security is a complex issue that de-5 pends on effectively using resources to maintain 6 operational control of the border while also facili-7 tating the movement of people, goods, and services. 8 (9) The American people want Congress to use 9 taxpayer dollars wisely and focus on middle-class 10 priorities, including economic development, edu-11 cation, and health care.

12 SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON CONSTRUCTION OF A UNITED 13 STATES-MEXICO BORDER WALL.

14 The Executive Order entitled "Border Security and 15 Immigration Enforcement Improvements" signed by the 16 President on January 25, 2017, or any other substantially 17 similar executive order, memorandum, or other action by 18 the President to use taxpayer dollars to construct a contin-19 uous wall or fence between the United States and Mexico, 20 shall have no force or effect.
