Katahdin Woods and Waters

- An exceptional example of the wild north Maine woods landscape with spectacular views of Mount Katahdin
- Numerous high-quality habitats, including hilltops and barrens, floodplain forests, bogs, brooks, streams and rivers
- Key habitat for a declining moose population and critical habitat for threatened Canada lynx, both of which need large ranges to survive
- Corridors for wildlife movement and connectivity with adjacent protected public lands
- Spawning and rearing habitat for endangered Atlantic salmon that will become available with the continued removal of downstream dams and reconnection of the Penobscot River with the sea
- Rare plants and insects, including copper butterflies, pygmy snaketails and Roaring Brook mayflies
