
CONSERVATION REPORT CARD

The Defenders of Wildlife Action Fund's *Conservation Report Card* for 2003-2004 measures the commitment of U.S. Senators and Representatives to wildlife and habitat conservation during the 108th Congress. It reviews 20 House votes and 13 Senate votes on key conservation issues, providing a clear assessment of how well members of Congress are protecting wildlife and wild lands for future generations.

The *Conservation Report Card* covers votes on drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge, protecting Alaska's Tongass National Forest, preserving forest wildlife, banning snowmobiles in Yellowstone National Park and on other legislation affecting endangered species and the habitat they need to survive.

The *Conservation Report Card* is an important resource constituents can use to examine their elected representatives' efforts to conserve our nation's natural heritage for our children and grandchildren. SENATE Key Votes

1 Blocking Arctic Refuge Drilling

The Senate voted to continue protection of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge by defeating a back-door maneuver by some members of Congress that could have led to the opening of the refuge to drilling.

2 Increasing Natural Resources Conservation Funding

The Senate rejected an amendment that would have restored funding cuts to a broad range of federal environmental and natural resource programs, including the important Conservation Trust Fund, which President Bush's budget cut by \$580 million.

3 Limiting Military Exemptions for Endangered Species

The Senate passed an amendment to a military spending bill that would have helped ensure that endangered species on military installations were adequately protected despite a successful proposal to exempt the military from key provisions of the Endangered Species Act. The Department of Defense has sought exemptions from key provisions of America's wildlife protection laws, even though government agencies have reported that these laws have not harmed military readiness. The Senate-passed amendment was removed from the legislation after the House and the Senate met to work out their differences with the final bill.

4 Lifting Protections for Energy Development on Tribal Lands

The Senate defeated an amendment that would have preserved existing environmental review and public participation requirements for energy development projects on Native American reservations.

5 Rejecting Requirement to Inventory Offshore Oil

The Senate rejected an amendment that would have protected our coastal waters from damaging oil and gas drilling. Instead, the provision that they allowed would have undermined an existing 22-year-old ban on oil and gas drilling in the waters off the coasts of California, Florida and other states. However, the damaging provision failed to make it into the final energy legislation due to efforts of the House of Representatives.

6 Weakening Tongass National Forest Protection


The Senate defeated an amendment to a funding bill that will make it harder for citizens to use the courts to challenge logging in the Tongass National Forest, the world's largest intact temperate rainforest.

7 Reducing Global Warming

The Senate defeated an amendment that would have helped to reduce global warming through measures including mandatory reductions in power plant emissions. The bill failed despite the fact that independent reviews revealed that it would have no negative costs to the U.S. economy and could have been beneficial economically.

8 Judicial Review of Timber Sales

The Senate defeated an amendment that would have protected the fundamental right of Americans to ask the courts to review timber sales that could be damaging to wildlife and wild lands. They passed a bill that boosts backcountry logging and limits the ability of citizens to stop damaging timber sales.



SENATE Key Votes

9 Limiting Environmental and Citizen Reviews of Timber Sales

The Senate defeated an amendment that would have helped to protect national forests, the wildlife in them and the right of Americans to participate in decisions that affect the forests. They passed a bill that boosts backcountry logging and limits the ability of citizens to know about or stop damaging timber sales.

10 Fake and Destructive Forest Fire Prevention

The Senate version of H.R. 1904 failed to provide the resources that communities need to protect themselves from wildfire. The bill was a boon to the timber industry by allowing logging of large fire-resistant trees in the backcountry far from communities and homes, rather than concentrating fuels-reduction activities in areas around fire-prone communities. The bill also weakened the requirement that the Forest Service consider alternatives to potentially damaging fuels-reduction projects, exempted fuels-reduction projects from public appeals and interfered with the important democratic and constitutional concept of maintaining an independent judiciary.

11 Anti-Conservation Energy Bill

Politics, money and anti-environmental policy converged and resulted in the Energy Policy Act of 2003, which passed the House and Senate and was sent to a committee to work out the differences between the two houses of Congress. The resulting bill endangers our clean air, drinking water and public lands and coastlines, squanders billions of taxpayer dollars on polluting industries and threatens national security. The Senate voted to block passage of the bill, which is now stalled.

12 Anti-Conservation Energy Bill

The Senate attempted to revive a stalled, fundamentally flawed energy bill that the Senate blocked in the previous session. This time the Senate stalled a scaled-down, but still damaging, version of the earlier bill. The most recent vote blocked passage of legislation that endangers our clean air, drinking water and public lands and coastlines and threatens national security.

13 William Myers Judicial Nomination

The Senate voted to block the nomination of a radical anti-environmental activist to the federal appeals court, which is the second highest court in the country.



HOUSE Key Votes

1 Sham Arctic Drilling Mitigation

The House passed an amendment that was falsely advertised as limiting the impact of drilling in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge.

2 Continuing Ban on Arctic Refuge Drilling

The House rejected an amendment to protect the Arctic Refuge from oil drilling.

3 Sound Forest Fire Prevention

The House rejected an amendment to protect communities and national forests from fire in a more effective and environmentally sound manner.

4 Fake and Destructive Forest Fire Prevention

The House passed legislation that failed to provide the resources that communities need to protect themselves from wildfire. The bill was a boon to the timber industry by allowing logging of large fire-resistant trees in the backcountry far from communities and homes, rather than concentrating fuels-reduction activities in areas around fire-prone communities. The bill also eliminated the requirement that the Forest Service consider alternatives to potentially damaging fuels-reduction projects, exempted fuels-reduction projects from public appeals, and interfered with the important democratic and constitutional concept of maintaining an independent judiciary.

5 Allowing Military to Weaken Protections for Endangered Wildlife

The House passed a motion that defeated efforts to allow a vote on an amendment to uphold protections for endangered species and marine mammals on military installations and in the world's oceans. As a result, the legislation the House passed granted dangerous new exemptions for the military from the Endangered Species Act and the Marine Mammal Protection Act. The Department of Defense has sought exemptions from key provisions of America's wildlife protection laws, even though the government agencies have reported that these laws have not harmed military readiness.

6 Reducing Conservation Funding


Efforts to restore funding cuts to the landmark Conservation Trust Fund, a program that was established to conserve some of the most important remaining natural treasures, were defeated in the House.

7 Protecting Wildlife Habitat in the Klamath Refuge

The House defeated an amendment to end the farming of environmentally damaging crops grown on Oregon's Lower Klamath and California's Tule Lake National Wildlife Refuges.

8 Banning Bear-Baiting

The House defeated an amendment that would have stopped the unethical hunting practice of baiting bears on national forests and Bureau of Land Management lands.



HOUSE Key Votes

9 Stopping Yellowstone Bison Killing

The House defeated an amendment that would have stopped the killing of Yellowstone National Park bison.

10 Preserving National Forest Wildlife Protections

The House defeated an amendment that would have stopped new rules for our national forests that eliminate existing wildlife protections and reverse decades of progress toward responsible forest management.

11 Preserving Ban on Snowmobiles in Yellowstone National Park

The House defeated an amendment that would have blocked the Bush administration's effort to stop the phaseout of snowmobiles in Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks and the John D. Rockefeller Memorial Parkway.

12 Reinstating National Forest Roadless Area Protection

This amendment would have stopped a damaging Bush administration initiative to gut the landmark Roadless Area Conservation Rule, adopted in 2000, that protects unroaded national forest lands from logging and development.

13 Rejecting Requirements to Inventory Offshore Oil

The House passed a resolution that called on House and Senate negotiators to drop a proposal that would undermine an existing 22-year-old ban on oil and gas drilling in the waters off the coasts of California, Florida and other states.

14 Maintaining Public Land Oil and Gas Drilling Protections

The House defeated an amendment that would have retained protections for clean water from the harmful effects of oil and gas drilling.



The House defeated an amendment that would have created a commission to study the Bush administration's politicization of science in the regulatory process.

17 Protecting Wildlife and Old Growth in Alaska's Tongass National Forest

The House passed an amendment that would protect old-growth stands of trees and important wildlife habitat by stopping taxpayer-subsidized logging-road construction in the Tongass National Forest – America's rainforest.



HOUSE Key Votes

18 Preserving Forest Wildlife for Future Generations

The House defeated an amendment that would have maintained wildlife protections, opportunities for public participation, science-based decision making and government accountability in national forest planning regulations.

19 Preserving Ban on Snowmobiles in Yellowstone National Park

The House defeated an amendment that would have allowed the continued phaseout of snowmobiles in Yellowstone and Grand Teton national parks and the John D. Rockefeller Memorial Parkway.

20 Sham National Security Vote

The House of Representatives passed an amendment that would exempt portions of an immigration barrier in Southern California from most federal environmental laws and regulations.
