Defenders of Wildlife Action Fund's 2014 Conservation Report Card measures the commitment of U.S. senators and representatives to wildlife and habitat conservation during the 113th Congress. It tells you at a glance how well your elected representatives are safeguarding our natural heritage for our children and grandchildren.

This report card reviews four Senate votes, three in 2013 and one in 2014, on issues ranging from building resilience to natural disasters and climate change to approving a destructive pipeline. It also covers 16 votes by a House of Representatives that continues to push an anti-environmental agenda of weakening the Endangered Species Act and pandering to special interests at the expense of America's wildlife and wild lands. These House votes addressed issues such as protecting an ecologically important bay in Alaska, allowing excessive and destructive logging in our national forests and using the drought in California as an excuse for undermining endangered species protections.

1 Funding Restoration and Enhancement of Natural Systems to Build Resilience

The Senate passed a bill that would provide emergency funding for repair and restoration of public lands and habitat damaged by Hurricane Sandy and for restoring and enhancing natural systems to build resilience against future disasters. *(January 28, 2013, Roll Call No. 4)*

2 Undermining Enforcement of the Clean Water Act

The Senate rejected an amendment that would have prevented the Army Corps of Engineers and the Environmental Protection Agency from clarifying the types of water bodies protected by the Clean Water Act. *(May 14, 2013, Roll Call No. 119)*

3 Damaging Borderland Wildlife and Habitat

The Senate rejected an amendment that would have required the construction of hundreds more miles of walls along on the Southwest border. *(June 18, 2013, Roll Call No. 151)*

4 Approving the Construction of the Keystone XL Pipeline

The Senate rejected a bill that would approve the construction of the environmentally destructive Keystone XL Pipeline. *(November 18th, 2014, Roll Call No. 280)*

1 Slashing Funding for Recovery of a Wildlife Refuge Impacted by Hurricane Sandy

The House passed an amendment to Hurricane Sandy response legislation that eliminated critical funds for rebuilding the Stewart McKinney National Wildlife Refuge. *(January 15, 2013, Roll Call No.19)*

2 Eliminating Land Acquisition From Hurricane Sandy Response

The House passed an amendment to Hurricane Sandy response legislation that barred the use of recovery funds to acquire federal land for fortifying damaged national wildlife refuges and parks. *(January 15, 2013, Roll Call No.21)*

3 Funding Restoration and Enhancement of Natural Systems to Build Resilience

The House passed an amendment that would provide emergency funding for repair and restoration of public lands damaged by Hurricane Sandy and additional significant funding for restoring and enhancing natural systems to build resilience against future disasters. *(January 15, 2013, Roll Call No. 22)*

4 Protecting Sensitive Private Lands for Wildlife and Water

The House voted down an amendment that would have encouraged farmers and ranchers to enroll their most environmentally sensitive lands in a federal conservation program. *(June 19, 2013, Roll Call No. 259)*

5 Slashing Funding for Private Land Conservation

The House defeated a bill that would have reduced private land conservation and habitat improvement

by \$4.8 billion over 10 years and prevented the attachment of conservation safeguards to harmful farm subsidies. *(June 20, 2013, Roll Call No. 286)*

6 Protecting Bristol Bay and Removing an Incentive to Coastal Drilling

The House rejected an amendment that would have protected ecologically important Bristol Bay in Alaska from oil and gas drilling and eliminated revenue-sharing provisions in the underlying bill that provide incentives for states to support oil drilling despite risks to their coastlines. *(June 29, 2013, Roll Call No. 299)*

7 Expanding Offshore Oil Drilling Dramatically to the Detriment of Wildlife and Our Coasts

The House passed a bill that would give the oil industry access to thousands of miles of coastline currently off limits to drilling, undermine bedrock environmental laws, create incentives for coastal states to support damaging oil drilling, and stifle the public's ability to hold the industry accountable. *(June 28, 2013, Roll Call No. 304)*

8 Destroying our National Forests Through Excessive Logging and Undermining Environmental Law

The House passed a bill that would dramatically increase logging on national forests and undermine bedrock environmental laws to the detriment of wildlife, drinking water and community access. The legislation includes trust proposals on O&C lands in Oregon and elsewhere that would upend decades of science-based forest management and planning and further harm endangered species. *(September 20, 2013, Roll Call No. 483)*



9 Countering Efforts to Undermine Environmental Review of Federal Water Projects

The House rejected an amendment that would have delayed implementation of provisions in the Water Resources Development Act intended to weaken environmental review. The amendment addressed the misconception that environmental review is delaying the completion of large-scale water projects, such as dams and port dredging, and highlighted the true cause of delay: the lack of funding to support the huge number and scale of authorized infrastructure projects. *(October 23, 2013, Roll Call 556)*

10 Expanding Oil And Gas Development on Public Lands and Encouraging Arctic Refuge Drilling

The House passed a bill that would prioritize oil and gas development over other multiple uses on public lands and give the state of Alaska the leverage to open the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge to oil drilling. *(November, 20, 2013, Roll Call No. 600)*

11 Maintaining Environmental Reviews for Potentially Damaging Uses on National Wildlife Refuges

The House rejected an amendment that would have removed harmful provisions in the underlying bill eliminating environmental reviews for all types of uses on national wildlife refuges. *(February 5, 2014, Roll Call No. 38)*

12 Using the California Drought as an Excuse for Undermining Endangered Species Protections

The House passed a bill that that would override Endangered Species Act protections in the California Bay-Delta, shut down the San Joaquin River

Restoration Program, preempt state water law, and undermine other environmental safeguards in the Bay-Delta. *(February 5, 2014, Roll Call No. 50)*

13 Advancing Environmentally Destructive Public Lands Legislation

The House passed a package of harmful public lands bills that would overturn endangered species protections at Cape Hatteras National Seashore, stop or delay reviews of grazing activities that could harm imperiled sage-grouse, and waive all environmental law for post-fire logging potentially harmful to wildlife habitat in the Stanislaus National Forest. *(February 6, 2014, Roll Call No. 54)*

14 Maintaining Timely Public Land Acquisition

The House rejected an amendment that would have removed a provision in a pending bill to needlessly slow or stop Bureau of Land Management land purchases. *(February 6, 2014, Roll Call No. 51)*

15 Weakening Oversight of Government Actions Impacting the Environment

The House passed a bill weakening public engagement and environmental review requirements for major federal actions under the National Environmental Policy Act. *(March 6, 2014, Roll Call No. 113)*

16 Restoring Scientific Integrity to Endangered Species Act Decisions

The House defeated an amendment that would have stricken a damaging provision from a bill already undermining the Endangered Species Act. The provision automatically defines all data

submitted by state, county or tribal governments as the “best available science,” regardless of its merit. *(July 29, 2014, Roll Call No. 461)*

17 Blocking Safeguards Against Pesticides Polluting Waterways

The House passed a bill that would gut existing Clean Water Act safeguards that protect our nation’s streams, rivers and lakes from excessive pesticide pollution. *(July 31, 2014, Roll Call No. 470)*

18 Approving Construction of the Keystone XL Pipeline

The House approved a bill that would approve the construction of the environmentally destructive Keystone XL pipeline. *(November 14, 2014, Roll Call No. 519)*

19 Weakening protections for Salmon, Birds and Other Wildlife in California

The House passed a bill that would override Endangered Species Act protections and threaten the conservation of salmon, migratory birds, and other fish and wildlife in California’s Bay-Delta estuary, as well as the fishing jobs in California and Oregon that depend on the health of these species. *(December 9, 2014, Roll Call No. 553)*

Defenders of Wildlife Action Fund was founded in 2001 after it became clear that the most vocal enemy of responsible environmental protection had become the elected leadership in Washington. The environmental movement needed to focus more on persuading elected officials to be good stewards of our land, air, water and wildlife. And it needed more political muscle to help defeat those who refused to do so.

Defenders of Wildlife Action Fund was formed to help provide that muscle. But the Action Fund's work has gone well beyond the ballot box. In addition to keeping voters informed of their legislators' records on issues that affect wildlife and habitat via this report card, the Action Fund has worked on Capitol Hill to block anti-conservation legislation, such as efforts to override the Endangered Species Act and to open the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge to drilling. In the coming years and election cycles, the Action Fund will continue to provide conservation with a voice in the political process in pursuit of its mission to conserve our nation's wildlife and natural heritage for future generations.
