WATCH OUT FOR WILDLIFE AWARENESS WEEK SEPTEMBER 18-24, 2011

WHEREAS, Native wildlife populations are an integral part of New Hampshire's natural environment and serve as an indicator of the overall health of New Hampshire's ecosystems; and

WHEREAS, Each year in the U.S. more than 200 people are killed in wildlife-vehicle collisions, 26,000 are injured and more than 1.5 million animals are hit on the road; and

WHEREAS, The average cost of property damage from these collisions is over \$1 billion annually; and

WHEREAS, The success of wildlife movement and survival in New Hampshire remains dependent on continued public education and an increased understanding of the essential role migration corridors play in wildlife movement; and

WHEREAS, Wildlife watching is one of the most popular outdoor recreational activities for tourists in New Hampshire. Wildlife awareness helps to keep drivers safe;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOHN H. LYNCH, GOVERNOR of the State of New Hampshire, do hereby proclaim SEPTEMBER 18-24, 2011 as WATCH OUT FOR WILDLIFE WEEK in New Hampshire and urge all citizens to be more vigilant of wildlife.
