Inhereas, the average cost of property damage from these collisions is over \$1 billion, and the total annual cost to society is \$8.4 billion; and

Whereas, wildlife watching is one of the most popular outdoor recreational activities for tourists in Oklahoma;

Now, therefore, I, Mary Hallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, do hereby proclaim third week in September, 2011 as

in the State of Oklahoma.
